After completing training, they became foster parents.

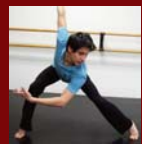

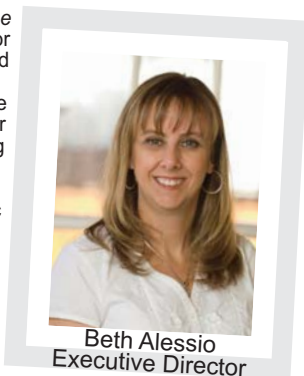


The Atencio's

"Life can change at the drop of a dime, and our job is to be there when that dime hits the floor." I remember Rhea Mugasis, the previous Executive Director of RMHC sharing those words with me over eight years ago when I first entered the doors of the Ronald McDonald House in Colorado Springs as the new Executive Director, single and without children. I understood the importance of providing a beautiful and tranquil home-away-from-home for families who were facing adversities with their children; I was proud of being part of such an amazingly important charity.

Now, eight years later, I'm married and have been blessed with two fantastic boys of my own.

Recently, a personal experience taught me what our families experience. We had taken a mini-vacation to Texas to visit friends and relatives; I was also going to attend the RMHC Executive Director's Conference. During the trip, our youngest became sick. A trip to Urgent Care revealed he had the flu, treatment was administered. We knew he was sick, we just didn't know how sick until we returned home to Colorado.

Being at a higher altitude, Zach could hardly breathe. As the day progressed his breathing grew more rapid. A doctor prompted us to head back to Urgent Care immediately. Zach had a pretty severe case of RSV and a touch of pneumonia. He was put on oxygen and transported by ambulance to St Francis Medical Center (SFMC) where he remained hospitalized for 3 days.

Months before, I had walked down the halls of the pediatric ward toward the Ronald McDonald Family Room, opened in late 2009. I would occasionally 'peek' into one of the empty hospital rooms; I remember seeing the cribs with their plastic covers. I had found myself quietly praying that I would never have to experience one of these rooms with either of my boys.

And here we were, in the hospital, Zach in the crib with the plastic cover, on oxygen, with an IV to help hydrate him. Nurses, respiratory therapists, and doctors came in at all hours, alerted by alarms going off. His oxygen intake was increased; antibiotics were given through the IV. Zach was crying, confused and scared about what was happening to him - he was so tired.

My husband and I were to remain strong for him. It was our job to comfort and reassure him. We tried to entertain him, encouraging him to drink, to eat, to rest. How do you tell a 20 month old that being poked with a needle and having tubes coming out of his nose and hand are there to help him? That he can't get out of the crib and run around? We did our best. We gave him hugs between the walls of the crib, we rubbed his back, sang songs, watched cartoons and brought in his favorite toys and blankets. Still, he wanted to be at home; we wanted that too... in due time.

We were juggling taking care of our five year old, Trevin, as well; trying to help him to understand what was going on. Thankfully, our friends came alongside. Thankfully we were able to take turns with Zach with either my husband or I sleeping in our own bed at night, taking turns taking care of Trevin. Thankfully, when Zach slept, we were able to sneak down the hall for some rest and a break in the Ronald McDonald Family Room.

My mind pondered, what if we hadn't left Austin when we did? What if we would have gone to urgent care the day before flying home and they would have admitted Zach to the hospital in Texas? What if we were stuck in Austin? Who was going to watch the house and the dogs back in Colorado Springs? Where were we going to stay? Would there be room at the Ronald McDonald House for us? How were we going to be able to take care of both boys in a large city we didn't know? What if this was for longer than three days?

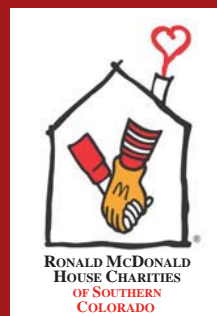
Memories of families filled my mind – the faces of those we've served through our Ronald McDonald House. I thought about all of the out-of-town families who stayed with us for months on end, keeping their vigil of walking back and forth to the hospital countless times every day and every night. I wondered how they kept it all together.

Then I remembered what I say when I speak to civic groups, businesses, schools and churches. Part of the magic of the Ronald McDonald House is not only having a safe refuge, but also the bond that occurs between families who are all facing adversities with their children. They gather strength from each other - crying together, laughing together, and breaking bread together. They learn to take care of themselves and each other. It's what happens within the walls of the Ronald McDonald House and the Family Rooms that help our families in so many ways: financially, emotionally, spiritually and physically.

Today, more than ever, I understand and respect what our families face. I am no longer only proud, but also fortunate to play a significant role in helping them through their children's medical crises. Ronald McDonald House Charities is a vital part of our hospital support systems, a vital part of our communities we serve, and a vital service to each and every child and family who experience one of our programs, whether it is the Ronald McDonald House, the Ronald McDonald Family Rooms or the Ronald McDonald Care Mobile. When a family says, "Thank God for you – we wouldn't have known what we would have done otherwise" – they mean it. Ronald McDonald House Charities is VITAL.

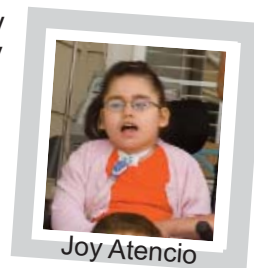

Each of the Atencio's children, four girls and three boys (two sets of biological siblings) were CHOSEN by Carla and Kevin, whose shared faith believes that long before they chose, God did. Kevin said simply that they were born to serve. "Knowing how much God loves us and how much He does for us.. We couldn't just look away. These kids' needs were so great and matched our desire and the capacity for love that He gave us." Some of their children have special needs. Adoptive and foster parents can be reticent about making those choices. Kevin and Carla *intentionally* chose those whose chances they thought were diminished.

The Ronald McDonald House Charities met this amazing family when their youngest, (appropriately named Joy), was airlifted to Memorial Hospital by Flight for Life. All of the Atencio children had been sick, but the others were recovering; Joy was not. Upon arrival, the doctors at Memorial found that her liver was enlarged, she had a yeast infection and her spleen needed to be removed. She was also diagnosed with H1N1. The family gathered to pray and support one another as her situation was so volatile. Carla said, "It was so scary to see her like that.. her despair, the difference in her appearance.. and, still, we chose to trust and believe.." Kevin added, "We thought we knew what faith was before that. Seeing her, like that, and still believing.. *that was faith.*"

It was touch and go for Joy for much of her three month hospitalization, with her eventually needing a tracheotomy. During that time, the Ronald McDonald House became a "home away from home" for the Atencio's. Our affection as staff and volunteers grew for these amazing kids, ages 11 – 19. They were bright and articulate; funny and helpful. They supported one another in ways that were profound.

Spending both Thanksgiving and Christmas at the Ronald McDonald House, and receiving respite in the Family Room just outside the NICU in Memorial, was in their words a "Godsend". Kevin said, "I thank God for the Ronald McDonald House. It literally became our home. It was a safe, comfortable place during such a hard time." Carla added, "When Joy was discharged, of course, we were ecstatic. I was surprised, though, realizing that I was sad to leave the 'House'." Kevin reiterated, "Yes.. and, as a private person, I wondered what our time there would look like. What I found were families who were just like us. They, too, needed a safe place, and found it at the Ronald McDonald House. The strength and camaraderie and support for one another were just incredible." Carla smiled at her husband and closed with "We were overwhelmed by the amount of love and support from strangers. They came for us in such memorable ways. A Thanksgiving meal with all the trimmings for all of us and the other nine families, too. Christmas gifts for not just our kids, but for Kevin and I, as well.. Yes. The Ronald McDonald House became our home. It was a place that allowed us to be together as a family. EVERYONE was awesome. Truly, it was a blessing.. magical."



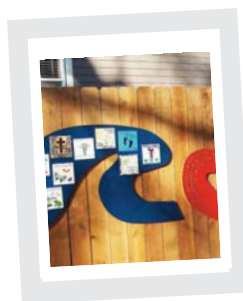

Care Mobile Update



In early 2009, RMHC of Southern Colorado "rolled out" the World's First "Green" Ronald McDonald Care Mobile in partnership with Peak Vista Community Health Centers. The Ronald McDonald Care Mobile travels four out of every five days to children throughout the Pikes Peak Region, providing both preventative and restorative medical and dental care to under-insured and uninsured children. We had a very successful first year! The Care Mobile served 2,338 clients for medical and dental needs with an additional 600 receiving H1N1 immunizations. Over 30 partnerships were formed with various organizations, schools, and health departments who are planning site visits for the Care Mobile to serve their children throughout 2010.

RMHC's reach has been expanded by the addition of Colorado's second Ronald McDonald Family Room, located inside St Francis Medical Center, serving families of Pediatric and Neonatal Intensive Care Unit patients. Housed in Pediatrics, the room has drawn even amounts of guests from both units. As with our first Ronald McDonald Family Room (located in Memorial's Hospital for Children), amenities include comfortable seating with flat-screened TV's, kitchenette complete with snacks/beverages, play area for siblings, computers with Internet access, printing capability, restroom facilities, showers and laundry facilities. There is always a warm, friendly volunteer who greets each and every guest.

Both Family Rooms are staffed 100% by volunteers and are open for guests 365 days a year, 12 hours each day, from 9:00am to 9:00pm. During these hours, families find respite inside our walls from the everyday stresses having a seriously ill child can bring. Thru our doors, guests settle -- they rest, contact family via phone and/or email, eat and remain strong for their children.

Currently, we have over 140 volunteers who

have embraced our mission -- truly, they are the backbone of our rooms.

Volunteers come from all walks of life - some are college students gaining hands-on experience; others are military personnel wanting to help those in need. There are health care workers who understand how hard it can be to have a loved one in the hospital and retired individuals who want to give back to their community. These

volunteers are the core of our program who have taken ownership of the Family Rooms. They share their compassion with everyone who walks thru our doors.

To date, between the two Family Rooms, we have had 30,000 guests! We are proud and honored to be able to help so many people in their time of need. We look forward to continue helping those with need.

Ronald McDonald is on hand to entertain the kids, while live auction items such as a Pebble Beach Trip, Avalanche Hockey tickets, and weekend getaways thrill the adults! The pre-tourney event is a fun-filled family event for everyone! The following day, golfers enjoy the challenge of the beautiful Broadmoor Mountain Course followed by a luncheon and awards ceremony at the Lodge.

The Cameron Memorial Golf Tournament began eighteen years ago when McDonald's Owner / Operators rallied support from McDonald's contractors to raise money for the Ronald McDonald House in memory of Brent and Marcie Cameron. Brent and Marcie were members of the McDonald's family in Colorado Springs for over 10 years, when Brent retired by purchasing 10 restaurants from the late Dick Faulkner. Brent and his wife, Marcie, were an inseparable team and their relationship served as an inspiration to everyone who met them. Proud supporters of Ronald McDonald House, Brent and Marcie tragically died in a mountain climbing accident in 1992. Eighteen years later, the Cameron Memorial Golf Tournament remains one of the largest annual fundraising efforts supporting the programs of Ronald McDonald House Charities of Southern Colorado (RMHC).

The **Ronald McDonald House** of Southern Colorado becomes a "home-away-from-home" for families of seriously ill children staying in nearby hospitals. **Since 1987**, the Ronald McDonald House has served over 7000 families, some staying as long as seven months.

The first **Ronald McDonald Family Room** in the state of Colorado is located inside the Children's Hospital at Memorial Main. The Family Room opened in **January, 2008**, providing families a comfortable and relaxing respite complete with computers and internet access, a play area for siblings, a kitchenette, shower and a washer/dryer to freshen up. The Family Room allows families to rest and regain their energy while remaining literally seconds away from their hospitalized child.

An economic downturn in 2009 had nonprofit organizations across the nation challenged as they faced decreases in support. RMHC of Southern Colorado was not immune to this; however, the organization also saw a growing number of children and families in need of more support services and chose to take a calculated risk to address those needs.

In **February 2009**, RMHC of Southern Colorado partnered with Peak Vista Community Health Centers, bringing the world's first "green" **Ronald McDonald Care Mobile** to the Pikes Peak Region. The biodiesel fueled Care Mobile travels to five counties along the Front Range four out of every five days providing both preventative and restorative medical and dental care to children and families who have access barriers to health care.

In **November 2009**, in partnership with St Francis Medical Center, RMHC of Southern Colorado opened the second **Ronald McDonald Family Room** in the state of Colorado, serving the hospital's pediatric patients and families.

Other **RMHC programs** allow our organization to "go beyond our walls" and support families and children in need throughout Southern Colorado. In partnership with McDonald's, RMHC provides **grants** to children's organizations, as well as **scholarships** that assist underprivileged students in furthering their education, many the first in their families to attend college.
